Recently Uber lost an appeal as the Tribunal decided that their 40,000 drivers are workers, and therefore entitled to benefits such as holiday and sick pay. It is important for community rugby clubs to understand the rules and regulations regarding legislation for employees. Whether it is casual bar staff, the club coach, an overseas import in the first XV or contractors working on club facilities, clubs need to know where they stand.

The Rugby Football Union Annual Report & Accounts was released this week and shows a record £99.6m investment into the game of rugby - a rise of 11% on the previous year, despite lower year-on-year revenues due to the Rugby World Cup 2015 revenues in 2016.

The operating loss for the year was £6m, reflecting the RFU's commitment to invest all profits into rugby.
