General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR)

Working to Together to Grow Rugby in Dorset and Wiltshire



The General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) came into force on 25 May 2018 and represented a reshaping of the data protection landscape.

In simple terms, GDPR helps protect the personal data of those involved in rugby by requiring better governance and transparency. Organisations holding personal data, including constituent bodies, referee societies and clubs, will need to give more information to people about what they do with those people's data, why, and for how long.

The RFU is pleased to provide guidance and resources via a toolkit, to help constituent bodies, referee societies and clubs work towards GDPR compliance. The toolkit provides an overview of the Regulation, what it means for rugby, and some practical steps you can take to ensure compliance.
