### **PREVIOUS ACTIONS/NOTES**

Thanks to Lizzie, Swanage & Wareham have made positive progress with 2 lease experts from the RFU (Matt and Jason), in providing support to their lease issues. The dialogue continues with them and the town council.

**Note -** Clubs should ensure First Aid Training is current – there are strict guidelines next season which need to be met.

Date of Next Meeting – ET to set this up – aiming for early March 22 and avoiding  $2^{nd}$  Monday in month to allow Bridport to attend.

## **FEEDBACK FROM CLUBS**

**Puddletown** – All going well within Puddletown, training progressing well with good numbers and game time going well. New players seem to be appearing which is positive, some returning to rugby after a number of years and some coming from various places around our county! Now have a covered area for supporters in miserable conditions which the grants has helped to achieve which is good and have many other plans for future projects.

**Sherborne** – 1<sup>st</sup> team performing well, 2<sup>nd</sup> team struggling for numbers and have had to pull out of league. Club are continuing to play games (seniors and age group rugby) on Friday night where possible – this is a good option for Sherborne and they are seeing different demographics attending these matches. Juniors and Ladies teams going well, also receiving coaching from 1<sup>st</sup> team players. Reduced bar income.

**Bridport** – Still ongoing with the project to take over the running of The Clubhouse from the Leisure Centre. Player numbers on the whole are good but injuries and availability have proved challenging. The junior section is in a good position. The only downside is still no Colts but we are hopeful for next Season.

One moan from the Junior Section is GMS and getting information from it especially who has paid!! (see Action 6.1 below)

**Swanage & Wareham** – Been a bit of a stop/start season, with a number of matches being cancelled including recent league game against Corsham. Fielding 3 teams and results are encouraging. Training numbers not as good as pre Covid. Good numbers in the minis/youth sections and Ladies fielding a team, lost recently to Trojans. Lease discussions continue with local council with support from RFU (see actions above). MH also briefed on development plans for the club including improvements to roof – which is in planning permission stage. Progressing Winter Survival Funding Loan – now getting VAT advice.

**Dorchester** – Has been an enjoyable season, although some disruption with Covid issues, in Junior section where there are a lot of isolations. Running  $1^{st}$ ,  $2^{nd}$  and  $3^{rd}$  teams and good results. Bar profits are down – believed to be because people are cautious about mixing in bars. Ladies (joint team with Weymouth) are enthusiastic and playing matches. Contracts relating to a previous disciplinary issue are progressing.

**North Dorset** - Running 2 senior men's teams plus a ladies team. Good numbers at training (30+) and 46 players. Good results. Training ground is getting a lot of usage, need to extend lights to allow more use of playing areas. Not suffered unduly with Covid issues. Have also hosted County Training. Age Group rugby going well, end of season tour going ahead. Had to call off social event over Xmas

**Blandford** – A really good first half of the season, player numbers are growing week on week. Hopeful that can keep a second team going with the increase in numbers and can fulfill fixtures for the rest of the season. Progress has been made with the redevelopment of the Larksmead site with concept drawings now being produced. Have been affected by COVID over this last week, 4 positive cases and 1 positive lateral flow after training on Thursday resulting in the postponement of game against East Dorset Dockers.

Mini's are growing slowly, but are having issues with getting coaches for age groups, U13's participated in a tournament being held at Milton Abbey school (with a little help from Wimborne) which was very successful giving them some meaningful game time. And U16's and U12's competing in the Cup fixtures that are now happening this side of Christmas. Not planning to take U16's to colts but instead they will be developed with the senior set up and brought into games once they reach 17. Aware that this will mean some players will not play next season but simply do not have the squad size to compete with other local clubs.

**Weymouth** – Running 2 senior sides, good results (2<sup>nd</sup> in league) and have seen several old players return to the club. Seen a drop off in volunteers in mini & youth and currently have no chair. Ladies team (with Dorchester) are playing matches. Club has managed some Covid issues. There have also been significant upgrades of the club, including upgrades to referee rooms and changing rooms.

# FCS (FUTURE COMPETITION STRUCTURE) / RFU / D&W Update

No issues reported with respect to League & Cup competitions. Main current activity is to see how leagues will pan out next year, looking to reduce travel, but some CBs very protective of their areas (not D&W). Potential for Bournemouth 2s in at Level 7 was mentioned. A number of clubs reiterated that they wanted to see the RFU move towards updating competition structure to

reduce the need for long distance travel. Noting moving East to West from Dorset is easier than travelling to Swindon from South Dorset.
