Age Grade

Introduction

The 2022/23 Age Grade Rugby season has now ended and it has been a positive experience for most.

The weather and ground conditions as well as injuries and other non-availability of players, allied to the fact that quite a few Clubs have some squads that are on the margins of viable numbers, have caused some games to be postponed or cancelled but because of good communication between clubs – the WhatsApp groups for each age grade have proved very helpful – and flexibility around Game On principles have ensured the vast majority of games were played. While there were still a few disturbing incidents of on and off pitch ill-discipline, the majority of games were played in a good spirit and this was reflected in some very complimentary comments about other Clubs' sportsmanship and hospitality that appeared on the WhatsApp Groups.

Numbers and Sustainability of Age Grade Sections

A small number of teams stopped functioning during the season and others were operating around the margins of viability but the majority managed to fulfil their programmes of training, friendlies and where relevant competitions. The regular updates on numbers affiliated by Club and Age Grade provided by Nicola McCombe are very informative and the subjective impression is that they now better reflect reality on the ground. We still need to work on ways to analyse and make better use of these data to focus our limited resources where they would be most effective in supporting Recruitment & Retention.

Age Grade Playing Calendar

With all stakeholders for male Rugby – Bath Rugby Academy / DPP, DW Age Grade Competitions, Schools and Bath Rugby Grassroots contributing – there were few potential clashes and the co-ordinated version has been completed by the RPPG and submitted.

Representative Rugby and DPP etc

The Under 17 and Under 18 Representative Rugby is managed separately and is not part of this report beyond the fact that we continue to work through the RPPG and directly with the Bath Rugby ERDPP to ensure that there is a smooth transition.

Liaison with the DPP, mainly via the RPPG, has continued to be effective and their programme of development training and their playing opportunities (some still to come) have been going well. Matt Lishman has been very helpful in addressing potential clashes over availability of players between Clubs and Beechen Cliff as an ACE College.

Bath Rugby Grassroots Department

The Bath Rugby Grassroots Department has become an increasingly important stakeholder continuing the work they did directly with players (Workshops, Camps etc) and adding activities such as Affiliate Tournaments for Clubs and assisting with Coach Development. They have become part of the RPPG.

A model has been talked about where Bath Rugby might provide a recruitment based support package in Schools funded by Clubs. Given the fact that the Clubs most in need of this are often those that can least afford it some financial support from either D&W or the RFU for such a programme would be welcome.

Third Party Providers

Mark Saltmarsh confirmed at the Age Grade Clubs Advisory Group that the RFU has no direct control over independent Third Party Providers.

If some sort of voluntary Accreditation Scheme could be offered for Third Party Providers this might give scope to use those who took part to extend the scheme being looked at with Bath Rugby Grassroots for Clubs to pay for the delivery of recruitment orientated support packages in Schools.

Age Grade Competitions

All the Competitions were completed before the end of the season. The Under 12 and Under 13 Tournaments were particularly well received. In the Under 18 Finals (five levels) all the games were decided by a single score.

By making use of the Game On principles and good communication and flexibility by the Clubs involved the vast majority of games were played although there were a small number of walkovers. These are discouraged by insisting that the club who is likely to be awarded the walkover does not receive the points unless they have made maximum effort to enable the game to be played. A number of squads were working close to the margins of viability and four dropped out in total during the season.

Considerable thanks are due to Julian Phelps and Jacquie Streener (assisted by Jared Budnarowski) for their substantial work on the Age Grade Competitions Programme.

Questions have been raised surrounding our interpretation of a Waterfall Competition and this is being discussed with the RFU. If necessary the precise format of our Under 12 to Under 14 events may be adjusted for 2023/24.

Schools Links

The Schools Union have continued to be pro-active in organizing events for schools and liaising through the RPPG. They have supported an increased number of local Schools festivals which can allow Clubs the opportunity for promotion of the Club Game.

Youth Forums and Huddles

Plans are progressing slowly with moving from County based Youth Forums to Age Grade meetings based on the Clubs in the existing Club Huddles. It is hoped to launch this from 2023/24.

Volunteers

We are still looking for more volunteers.

More organisers for each individual Age Grade Waterfall or Competition to spread the workload.

A lead for each Age Grade Huddle.

Possibly somebody to co-ordinate the work done across the Age Grade Landscape bringing more closely together the work done by the Age Grade Lead (predominantly with Clubs matters), Representative Lead (with Under 17 and Under 18) and the Chair of Women & Girls (with the Girls programme). The degree of separation of these areas in Dorset & Wilts is not typical of other CBs in the South West and is sometimes unhelpful – e.g. the Girls section of the AGPC is not populated in our version beyond the basic RFU template.

Meetings etc

NE attended an RPPG meeting on 2 May 2023

NOTES:

A brief summary of last night's meet which was somewhat of a wash up as the season moves towards the end.

Welcome to Tom Page Grassroots Manager and Coach Educator at Bath who joined the group for the first time.

DPP:

ticking along nicely. Good positive feedback from Parents and a great feel of positivity all across the board. U14s up and running with 25 players at each of the 5 centres. U16s completed their programme with very little negativity around. 55 of them have moved to U17 and will do a pre season before a further cull. Those who don't make it will have the opportunity of two open trial games so chance for a number of reentry points.

U15s had a Festival in Feb HT and group selected pre Academy. U14s and 15s have end of season Festivals and the latter games with Midlands Central.

Change this year was to give the U15s more of a team feel, skills in contact, set piece, backs moves etc. Identifying with the site or centre worked well and something DPP Manager hopes to build on.

Issues are still staffing. Trying to fill coaching gaps particularly in Dorset. Travel time for players and facilities at some of matches.

D. and W. ACL.

Lots more positives than negatives in clubs and greater awareness about whole DPP programme and beyond. Lots of good examples of sportsmanship etc amongst players commented on.

Issues retention of players remains a major issue and led to withdrawals from some cups etc. Challenge to keep rugby attractive to many youngsters with conflicting demands.

Grassroots Manager and Coach Educator.

Restructuring of department has led to developing relationships with clubs and schools. 772 active members with 46 clubs on board. Affliate meetings initially held at Farleigh House or Rec but now taking place locally as result of feedback from potential participants. Again lots of positivity and very useful feedback from coaches who are encouraged to voice concerns and requirements. Regional Festivals and 29 schools now part of Partnership Programme. Some clubs using programme to increase playing

numbers. Many coaches asking for change in Affliate nights so less classroom and more hands on. Many expressing disappointment and mistrust in RFU!!

Felt change of perception as to what Bath rugby trying to do. Filling a void left by RFU cutbacks and funding.

Issues are imbalance in pop. Between D. and W. and the demands therein. Lack of CPD which trying to fill. Need to merge some clubs at U15 because of low numbers.

D. and W. Schools:

Lots and lots of activity and again positivity abounds. Lots of 10s, 7s and 15s. Dorset and Wilts trying to offer similar Festivals, Leagues and Comps in both parts of counties. A great of collaboration is taking place between schools, clubs and Bath Grassroots. 600 took part in the various Dorset Schools sevens. 250 Girls attended a Girls Dev. Day which also saw Active Dorset involved, yet another stakeholder. Mention of forthcoming Touch to Twickenham which sees Swanage and Wareham host one competition with winners appearing at HQ.

Issues are lack of rugby specialists in some schools, lack of rugby programme and limited funds.

Academy Manager:

Completion of U18 prog and 8 offered full contracts. 2-3 others might join as scholars. Those exiting to BUCS univs or Brunel with Trailfinders link. U17s block April/May. Keeping numbers higher due to demands of Prem Cup etc. More coaches joining Senior Academy and new Bath Univ. agreement signed to allow players to access another programme. New Head of Rugby Programme at Beechen Cliff to be appointed.

Last thoughts.

Need for more coaches to involve them selves in programme and lines of communication to remain open. Looking to build on positivity and collaboration.

RFU Council Representative

Previous month's activity:	Attended RFU Council meeting Friday 21 st April- some notes from the meeting have been circulated to clubs and D&W Council.
	Prior to the meeting we were invited to attend the 'Bystander' training.
	This has bene listed as something the CB would be interested in but has not, as far as I am aware, been run. I would certainly recommend looking at this for not only members of D&W Council but also maybe for clubs who might have discipline issues around behaviour from the touchline etc.
	At the RFU meeting it was agreed the law changes to look at lowering the tackle height to the bottom of the sternum. This detail has been sent to clubs via a CGU.
	There is also now a dedicated part of the England Rugby website with information around tackle height.
	https://www.englandrugby.com/participation/playing/tackle-height
	Attended the April CB national call- in this it was mentioned about the funding support for clubs with Female players, linked to the RWC2025 bid. As part of this clubs have been able to apply for grants for Sanitary Provision, Female Toilets, Female Friendly Social Space and Female friendly changing rooms. 363 Sanitary packages were awarded, 332 toilet upgrades, 15 social space and 3 future concept female changing rooms have bene awarded. Phase 2 will focus on social spaces and clubhouse welcome packs- in the run up to RWC2025.
	Also mentioned was the fact that the Governance & Business Transformation Project that was open to sides at Regional level has now been expanded to teams playing Counites 3 and above.
	The Club and CB Development sub-committee were approaching CB's to work with clubs to identify 3 key areas for clubs as key objectives for the coming season. The survey had a very short timeline- DID D&W REPLY?
	Other News Rugby Safe- this area is constantly being updated to continue to focus on Player Welfare.
	Question- who is our Rugby Safe Lead now for D&W?
	Clubs need to think about Risk Assessments- this is mentioned in Rugby Safe. Also clubs are encouraged to use the PROACTIVE App- costs £50 per club and a great tool to use to make life a little easier for the volunteer.

	New Concussion guidelines have come out- these have hopefully been circulated to clubs and clubs are taking notice of them- note it takes the
	mandatory time away from contact for a player back to at least 21 days.
	League Structures - details should be in the CGU on the 16 th May. This will also include the structured season. Fixtures will hopefully be out end of May or early June. Last league weekend is after Easter- 6 th April and after this it will be Cups again.
	Payment of Player Declaration - clubs need to do this- its on GMs under Organisation Profile- Questionnaires. Clubs have until 30 th June to complete this.
	Papa John's Cup- we know there have been some teething issues with this being the first season, I have been asked to gather feedback across the Country which, as many will no doubt expect, has shown a number of key themes. However, those who did progress and managed to reach a final it seems to have really helped to gel the club and local support.
	Next season one of the main focus areas will still be Adult Male Recovery- driving demand, improving retention and enhancing supply of games. Local merit tables have been hit the hardest in relation to lower match competition. Last season a number of clubs received targeted help, it is planned to continue this into next season and potential clubs are being looked into at the moment.
Other items for discussion (please attach paper with estimated discussion time allocation)	Does the CGU get fully circulated not only around Council but also internally within clubs. I fear that not circulating this is leading to many a question being raised where details have been sent out but not shared to a wider audience.
	Is our CB facility plan up to date and can this be circulated around D&W Council.
	We need to elect a representative from D&W to be a voting member of the SWROC. Actively serving league secretaries will not be able to be voting members of the ROC. Full TOR can be supplied to any interested party - I would suggest this is maybe something for either Ed or Dave W to consider.




